

# Terms and Conditions

- Road bikes will only be accepted on the 11km and **not** the 28km or 53km.
- All entrants deem to accept the condition of their equipment prior to the event and should continue to perform equipment checks throughout the challenge. There is a free bike check-over available in the event-village, when you have finished your chosen route, through Certini Bicycle Co.
- Please carry puncture repair equipment just incase you or someone else might need it. We do have support out on route that can help you with this but it will take time to get to you.
- There is no minimum age for the 11km route. Entrants must be aged 9 years and above for the 28km and 12 and above for the 53km. All entrants up to 16 must always be accompanied by a parent or guardian. The parent or guardian must also register for the event; this is very important.
- 17-year-olds must be given consent to take part but can cycle the route without being accompanied by an adult or guardian.
- Please note; places are limited and you cannot register on the day.
- If you chose to withdraw from the event, you must let a member of the St Luke's Events team know or locate your nearest marshal and give them your bib number and name, this is very important.
- The entry fee is £20 for the 11km route and £40 for the 28km and 53km routes. The entry fee only covers the cost of your participation at the event and is non-refundable.
- All entrants must register in advance via the registration website. All entries will be processed in the order that we receive them. Closing date will be 9am on Thursday 8 October 2026, subject to availability. We advise getting your registration in early to avoid disappointment.
- Payment must be received with each entry. If paying by cheque, please put your name and address on the reverse.
- Please do not send cash in the post. A credit/debit card facility is available online or by calling 01752 492626.
- It is crucial when registering a team, you specify all entrants' individual details including postal addresses and email addresses. This is to ensure all correct correspondence will go to the right entrant.
- You are not permitted to use any of the sponsorship money you raise to pay for your expenses. All sponsorship money given to you must be passed directly to St Luke's Hospice Plymouth.
- You are not permitted to 'give' your place to anyone else. If you are unable to take part on the day, please contact the Fundraising Team ASAP on 01752 492626 or email [events@stlukes-hospice.org.uk](mailto:events@stlukes-hospice.org.uk)

- Alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- All entrants must acknowledge that there are risks inherent in the event and each participant voluntarily agrees to assume (for themselves and their next of kin) all such risks and hereby release St Luke's Hospice Plymouth from any liability.
- Please adhere to the Dartmoor County Code:
  - Keep to public paths across farmland where possible.
  - Ensure you personally close all gates that you go through.
  - Leave livestock, crops, and machinery alone.
  - Do not drop any litter.
  - Be mindful of wildlife, plants, and trees.
- Any riders seen not adhering to the Highway Code / Dartmoor County Code will not be able to continue this event and will be removed with immediate effect.
- Please remember to keep noise levels to a minimum and behave in a respectable manner, considering residents, fellow cyclists, and volunteers.
- The route is not closed to the public and therefore you must respect other road users, walkers and cyclists.
- Tour de Moor is not a race, should you wish to record your time we suggest you bring your own method to do so.
- By taking part in the event, you implicitly authorise the future use of your photograph or video for publicity purposes.
- We reserve the right to change the fees, event details, prizes, and any aspect of event management.
- Your first event pack which will be sent via email will include confirmation of your place, a link to download your sponsorship form and an essential guide containing all FAQs, including a route map.
- Your second event pack will arrive a few days prior to the event and will contain a t-shirt and bike board, this will come directly from a third party. There will be spares available at the Information Point at the event, if needed.
- You must wear a cycle helmet whilst on route, along with your event t-shirt and bike board. You will not be able to take part without these. This is non-negotiable. If you are seen riding without a helmet, you will not be able to continue in this event.
- Ideally, you will wear the T-shirt provided in your pack in the size you have ordered. However, there will be a small number of extras, so a swap is available if needed on the day (subject to availability).
- Dartmoor National Park Authority do not allow dogs at any events, so you cannot bring your dog.
